

Church Will Re-Open for Private Prayer
Wednesday, May 13 from 11 am to 2 pm

To All the Good People of St. David the King:

I am pleased to inform you that our spiritual home, our church of St. David the King will be re-opening on Wednesday May 13, the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima!

This opening consists of a phased-in process. Beginning next Wednesday, the church will be open for private prayer from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm and on every weekday thereafter; I call it “Lunch with the Lord,” spending quiet time in the Presence of the Divine.

Regrettably, we are not ready from a health perspective, nor have we been given the all clear sign to resume our celebration of the sacraments. Let us fervently pray that we can go to Mass and receive the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist soon but for now the church is only opened 11:00 am – 2:00 pm Monday - Friday for private prayer.

To ensure the health, safety and well-being of all, the following practices are to be observed:

1. Only 10 persons are allowed in the church at any given time.
2. Wearing facial coverings is must for everyone over the age of 2 years of age.
3. Social/physical distancing of 6 feet is to be observed.
4. Kindly avail yourself of the hand sanitizer dispensers located at the entrances to the worship space.
5. Please use center aisle and sit in the right side center section of pews only.
6. After a pew is used, leave the kneeler down so area can be cleaned. (Unless you choose to sanitize it before you leave.) Do not sit in a pew if the kneeler is down.
7. Please no socializing or public gatherings in the gathering area or in front of the church.

These directives pertain to the reopening of Church **for private prayer**. Other plans regarding Mass will be communicated when they are developed. Suffice it to say that when Mass returns, it is most important to remember, that due to social/physical distancing, seating capacity in the church and youth hall will be limited to 175 max. Reservations anyone?
